



Goole Museum is on the first floor above Goole library. A permanent exhibition gallery explores the history of the town and port of Goole, with a variety of hands-on activities for children. The temporary exhibition gallery has changing exhibitions throughout the year, from art, craft and photography to local and social history. Groups welcome: room available to book on request.



The museum has a fine collection of ship portraits by Goole-born artist Reuben Chappell, many of which are on permanent display, as well as an extensive photographic collection covering Goole, its ships, and the surrounding towns and villages.

Museum at Sewerby Hall



Sewerby Hall is a Grade I listed Georgian country house with Regency and Victorian additions, set in 50 acres of parkland and gardens. The Museum at Sewerby is located within the Hall itself and contains an important collection of Amy Johnson memorabilia and galleries in which a temporary exhibition programme is displayed. Groups are welcome: room available to book on request.



In addition to the Hall and Museum there are gardens and a glorious view of Bridlington Bay, as well as a zoo, woodland walks, a landtrain, picnic areas, children's facilities and a range of outdoor entertainment throughout the year.

Treasure House & Beverley Art Gallery



The East Riding Treasure House provides museum, library and archive facilities under one roof, plus access to the adjoining Edwardian exhibition spaces of Beverley Art Gallery.



The Treasure House also has two museum gallery spaces with displays of East Riding 'treasures' and temporary exhibitions, many with a regional history and heritage flavour.



The tower is worth visiting for the splendid views over the rooftops of Beverley.



Both museum and gallery have plenty of childrens' activities and there is a coffee lounge for refreshments. Groups welcome: room available to book on request.



Beverley Guildhall



The Beverley Guildhall is a Grade I listed building which has had a long and fascinating history. Originally purchased by the Beverley town keepers in 1501, it has been in continuous civic use since then.



It is worth visiting this beautiful building, if only for the stunning Georgian courtroom featuring plaster stucco-work by Giuseppe Cortese. The courtroom also still retains evidence of the building's roots as a medieval great hall.

The two rooms of the Beverley Community Museum show temporary exhibitions on the local history of the town and displays of items from the Guildhall's museum collection. There is also a computer archive of historic photographs of Beverley.

Skidby Windmill and Museum of East Riding Rural Life



Skidby Mill is a working four-sailed tower mill, set in an acre of land, with magnificent views over the Wolds.

The mill normally operates between Wednesday and Sunday, (wind permitting), producing wholemeal flour which is sold in the museum shop. As there is only one miller, visitors are strongly advised to ring in advance to ensure the miller is on site when a visit is planned.



The warehouses next to the mill contain exhibition galleries exploring the agricultural and social history of the East Riding, with lots of hands-on activities and trails for children. Outside, there is a wildlife garden, a mill field and children's play area, and a great place for picnics if not using the courtyard café.

Daily: 10am to 5pm (last admission 4.15pm). Closed on Good Friday, Christmas, Boxing Day, New Year's Day. Lunchtime closing is 12.30pm - 1.00pm.
